

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This week I would like to discuss faith with you to which St. Paul states is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen.

As many of you know both my father and sister were diagnosed with cancer in April of 2012. My dad with prostate cancer and my sister with breast cancer. It has been a long year for both of them and my entire family. However, what helped us get through the year was all the prayers offered up by you (Thank you) and by our faith. Faith has always been a very important part of our lives. I remember from the earliest years of my life saying my nightly prayers and always have that sense that I was never alone in this world and that whatever I faced I had God at my side or even carrying me in His arms.

Well God has carried both my dad and my sister along with my whole family in His arms for well over a year now. I am happy to report that my father is now cancer free and doing just fine. My sister Suzanne is not at the end of her road yet. The cancer was removed with surgery, chemotherapy and radiation. She was doing fine and it seemed that all our hopes were realized. However, just recently she had a set back and her blood work came back questionable. We are now awaiting further test to determine if the cancer is back. However, faith is not just the realization of what was hoped for but rather it is having hope to start with when we face dark times. My family and I are not set back by this latest news rather we find ourselves growing even stronger in our faith as we know God carried us through the first year and He continues to carry us today. I have faith that my sister will be just fine and I have faith that God will help us face whatever we have to face and that our greatest hopes will be realized if not in this lifetime but in the next when we join Christ at the heavenly banquet.

My brothers and sisters let us also keep the faith and let us always be a people of hope knowing that our God walks with us every day of our lives.
