PD Reflections,

As we begin summer, I have a long tradition of a reading week with a priest friend. We go to the Jersey shore and rest, eat well and catch up on some reading. Books that we have received as gifts, periodicals that we haven't kept up and daily papers as well. I am sure there are others looking for some reading material. A local pastor published a long list of suggestions in the parish bulletin.

I plan to read the recent encyclical Laudato Si' and encourage others to do the same. I have read parts of it online but I am one of those people who prefer to hold a book in my hand.

As expected, the response to the publication of this 184 page document. Some have praised it while others have condemned it.

As I read some sections, I believe the purpose of this document is to start a dialogue, a discussion. It is addressed to all the people of the earth and calls us to reflect on the state of our common home. The title comes from the famous Canticle of the Sun of St Francis of Assisi. It means praise be to you. St. Francis praised God for creation, for brother sun and sister loon. St. Francis saw the Creator manifest in creation. Pope Francis asks us to look at what is happening to the earth, our home. In recent years there has been some progress as laws have been enacted about the air we breathe, the oceans we vacation alongside, the rivers around us.

The encyclical can be found online and there have been many responses that have been printed in this first week. Some may want to take a look now.

Simple things like recycling have been around for several years and we have seen many calls for an end to plastic bottles and bags. It seems to me that what Pope Francis has done is to connect such practices with our faith and the tradition of the church. The Book of Genesis tells us that God saw that creation was good. May all those who call planet earth a common home help to keep it that way.
