

Sacrament of Baptism


Parents should register for the Baptism Preparation Program at the rectory...even before the baby is born!

Hunger in the Land of Plenty

A recent study (*Hunger in America 2014*) reported that hunger remains a very real problem in New Jersey. Almost 900,000 people, over 10% of the population, rely on food banks.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly called Food Stamps), funded by the federal government and administered by the states, has been a first line of defense against hunger. In 2014 all New Jersey SNAP households saw a decrease of about 5%. The average benefit is a little less than \$1.40 per meal.

Food banks and food pantries (like the one at St. Mary's) are a vital part of feeding those who are experiencing food insecurity, of which 40% are children.

Consider helping to feed the hungry and experience what working at a food bank is like by volunteering to serve at the New Jersey Community Food Bank in Hillside.



On Saturday, October 3, we will gather in the parking lot of St. Mary's at 7:30 am and carpool to the food bank. We'll spend the morning sorting food for distribution to food pantries throughout the state.
