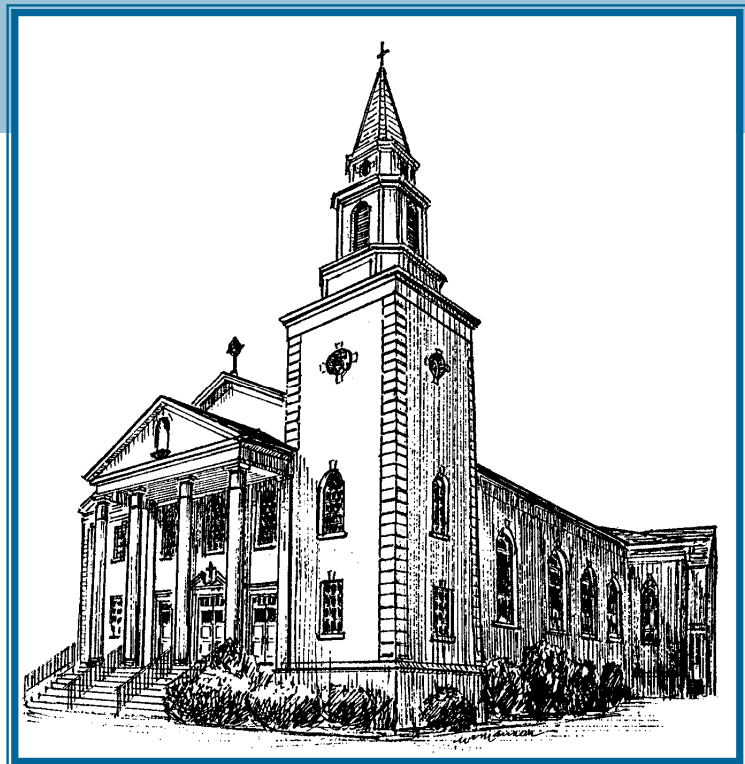

On Saturday, March 19th, the priest of St. Mary's will join the priests at St. John's, Bergenfield and the Church of the Ascension, New Milford, for our annual Lenten Penance Service. This year's service will be hosted by St. John's at 1:00 pm.

As we prepare for the celebration of Easter, each of us is called to examine our lives and see where we have failed. Each of us is invited to confess our sins and receive absolution. But all too often I am asked why. If God already knows my sins better than I do and God knows how sorry I am for my sins, why do I need to go to confession? If we believe in a God of unconditional love, this is a legitimate question. It is a question that has led many good Catholics to give up on the idea of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

First we must remember that we are corporeal beings. We learn through our senses and there are times we need to hear the words that tell us that our sins are forgiven. More importantly, we need to remember that Reconciliation is a sacrament. It is a moment of grace when God's love wipes away our sins and gives us the strength to do better. If we do not avail ourselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we deny ourselves the concrete experience of hearing that our sins are forgiven and we deny ourselves the grace of a sacrament that is God gift of healing love.

I encourage everyone to join us next Saturday for our Penance Service. If you're unable to do so, I encourage you to find an opportunity to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, we are called to remember that there is no sin that cannot be forgiven, there is no one who is not welcomed and that God's mercy knows no bounds
