# From the Pastor



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While out to dinner a few weeks ago, a friend of mine was complaining about the 4<sup>th</sup> of July falling in the middle of the week. He suggested that it should be moved to a Monday or Friday so that people could have a three-day weekend. As he said, “Having a holiday on a Tuesday just isn’t convenient.”

I guess he’s right, not that it matters too much to me. After all, I work weekends. But suggesting that we move a holiday for convenience sake usually means we’ve forgotten the original reason for the holiday.

It certainly wasn’t convenient for those men who spent the summer of 1776 in Philadelphia nor was it convenient for them to sign the Declaration of Independence. By doing so, they risked their lives and their livelihood. And it wasn’t convenient for the soldiers who fought and died to make the ideal of that Declaration a reality.

It has been no more convenient for all the men and women who have fought for the past 241 years protecting those liberties that we all too often take for granted. It is definitely not convenient for the members of our Armed Services who continue the battle of freedom in the far off parts of the world where our ideals of freedom and democracy are threatened.

Instead of complaining about having to have our barbecues and fireworks on Tuesday, maybe we should say a prayer of thanks for all those who have worked to insure that we live in a nation where we are free to celebrate all the gifts that God has given us.
