

Wednesday, November 1, All Saints day is a Holy Day of Obligation. Our Mass schedule is 7:00AM, 8:45AM and 7:30PM in the upper church.

<u>All Souls Remembrance - Nov. 2</u>

On Thursday, Nov. 2, the Church remembers the souls of all those who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith.
