## From Beth Miloscia

Today the Catholic Church celebrates Catechetical Sunday. We recognize and bless the ministers of our parish who teach our young people through religious education and sacramental programs, children's liturgy and choir, vacation bible school and youth ministry. Being involved in these ministries has shown me not only how important it is for us to pass on our faith to the young people we encounter but also how important it is for us to listen to them. My faith has continued to grow while working in these ministries because of the questions my first Communicants ask me or the conversations I have with Confirmation candidates or members of our youth group. That's the beauty of our faith; it is relational.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks His disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" If Jesus asked you this same question, what would you say? If we want to answer this question we need to get to know Jesus; to have a personal relationship with Him. This relationship begins at our Baptism and continues to our entire lives. It is easier when we are younger because we have a structured religious education program that allows us to learn about our faith throughout the year. But, once we receive Confirmation our faith is up to us and that is why youth ministry is so important.

Youth group offers our high school students an opportunity to continue to strengthen their relationship with Jesus and to be a part of a community that encourages and supports them as they discern who God is calling them to be. All of us, by virtue of our Baptism, are called to share our faith by the way we live. So, on this Catechetical Sunday, I encourage you to take a moment to reflect on how you can share your faith with our young people. Volunteer for one of our ministries. Invite young people that you know to come to a youth group meeting. Encourage youth that you see at Mass to get involved in our parish. And let us all pray for our youth that they may have the courage to take up their cross and follow Jesus always.
