Our celebration of Pentecost brings an end to the Easter Season and the Church officially re-enters Ordinary Time. We still look forward to the major feasts of Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Sacred Heart and so many others but the special seasons of Lent and Eastertide are over and this long period of Ordinary Time will be with us to the end of the liturgical year when we will celebrate the Feast of Christ the King and begin a new liturgical year with the Season of Advent.

This extended period of Ordinary Time is so very important because it reminds us that it is in ordinary events of daily life that we will most likely encounter God. Also, it is the ordinary times of our lives that we are given the opportunity to serve God but simple acts of kindness to our brothers and sisters in Christ. There is nothing ordinary about God’s love for us. But it is in simple, everyday events of our lives that we encounter God’s love and it is where we are called to reflect God’s love by what we say and do. All too often we seek God in the extra-ordinary; in the monumental moments of life. God wants us to remember that He is with us in the simple and everyday moments as well.

The cycle of the Liturgical Year reflects the calendar year with its times and seasons. But it reminds us that we are headed to something far from ordinary. We are called to live in world with our eyes focused on a world that will never end. The Easter Season may have come to an end but we are an Easter people who live in the knowledge that Christ has died for our sins and, in His Resurrection, has conquered death for all time. Christ has ascended to the glory of heaven and He offers the hope of eternal salvation to all who listen when He says, “Follow Me.”

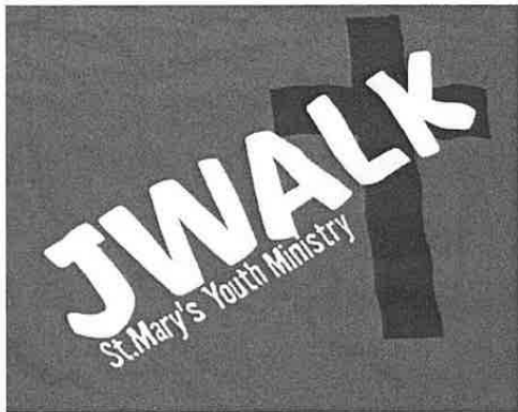
