Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

Vigil to Remember Victims of Gun Violence Sunday, December 15th

Today, St. Mary's will join various organizations around the country remembering the victims of gun violence in the United States. After the 10:00 am Mass we will gather on the front steps of the church in a silent vigil as the church bells toll 28 times, one each for the victims of the Sandy Hook shooting.

Nothing may make us feel more helpless than when we witness gun violence, especially against children. We wonder what we can do to try to stop the senseless cruelty on such a large scale, and how complex it may be to change a culture that creates it, or laws to prevent it.

"Blessed too are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God." And so there are ways each person can do something to make a difference, as Jesus did with a group of followers.

In the same way that Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) got meaningful changes to help keep drunk drivers off the road, there is an organization concerned about gun violence, Moms Demand Action - NJ. You can learn more about them on Facebook.

Another local organization that is very active in working on New Jersey legislation is Ceasefire NJ - Coalition for Peace Action.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops issued this statement on gun violence in August, 2019: "We call for effective legislation that addresses why these unimaginable and repeated occurrences of murderous gun violence continue to take place in our communities. As people of faith, we continue to pray for all the victims, and for healing in all these stricken communities. But action is also needed to end these abhorrent acts."
