From the Pastor



The 4th Sunday of Easter is called "Good Shepherd Sunday" because each year we read a different part of St. John's Gospel about Jesus, the Good Shepherd who cares for all his sheep. The Church has designated Good Shepherd Sunday to be a World Day of Prayer for Vocations. While it is important to remember that each of us is called to a particular vocation be it married life, single life or a vocation to priesthood or religious life, Good Shepherd Sunday reminds us of a special need to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood.

In these difficult times, as we face the threat of the corona virus, we must also ask God to protect His priests. In Italy, more than 87 priests have died from the corona virus. I have read about a number of priests in the US who have tested positive. While we take all the precautions possible and we are limited in what we are allowed to do, the fact remains that our ministry brings us into contact with so many different people.

St. Luke's Gospel reminds us we must "Ask the Master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." We must also ask the Master to protect all priests so that they can continue to minister in His name.
