Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

As we struggle to get back to some sense of normalcy, the staff of St. Mary's has found a way to provide the Sacrament of Reconciliation that protects both the priest and the penitent with appropriate social distancing.

Please note that our procedure will provide confession face-to-face and will be by appointment only. You do NOT have to provide your name to come for confession.

Our celebration of Pentecost brings an end to the Easter Season and the Church officially re-enters Ordinary Time. We still look forward to the major feasts of Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Sacred Heart and so many others but the special seasons of Lent and Eastertide are over and this long period of Ordinary Time begins. But there is nothing ordinary about the life of the Church right now.

It has been more than two months since we have been able to come together to worship as a community of faith. It has been more than two months since you have been able to receive the Eucharist. It is only recently since we have been able to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation and while we are permitted to say the committal prayers when someone dies, we are still not allowed to offer a Funeral mass. No, there is nothing ordinary about the times we are living through. But there is hope.

Just as the Holy Spirit gave the disciple the courage to come out from behind locked doors to proclaim the Good News of Salvation, the Holy Spirit will give us the strength to persevere through the current restrictions firm in our faith in God's love. As we take cautious steps back to some sense of normalcy, we must trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us as we strive to protect ourselves and our loved ones. As we struggle through the threat of infection and the economic difficulties generated by the pandemic, the Holy Spirit will show us how to assist those in need.

Pentecost is a celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit; the Spirit given to the disciples on the first Pentecost, the Spirit given to all of us in the waters of Baptism, the Spirit that is with us through all the trials of life. Let us live in the gift of the Spirit confident in God's abiding presence.
