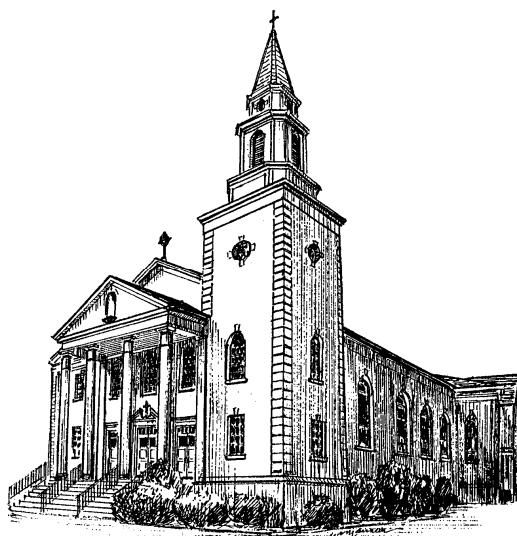

Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

Our upper church will be open for daily mass at 7:00am and 8:45am and will remain open until 2:00pm each day.

We resumed our Sunday Masses this weekend, June 28th Please call the parish office or use the email contactus@stmarysdumont.org to reserve the time you're attending the mass. (Please see Fr. Carey's column for details.)

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- ◆ All visitors must maintain a 6-foot social distance from others at all times. Please sit only in designated pews. Members of the same household (living together) should sit together in designated areas.
- ◆ To maintain proper social distance, no one may sit in the marked off center of the pew.
- ◆ All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.
- ◆ All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- ◆ Please be careful and try to limit the number of surfaces that you touch in the church. The doors will be propped open for this reason.
- ◆ Please do not leave anything behind in the church such as tissues, papers, gloves, etc.
- ◆ If you are sick or have been in contact with someone who is sick, please do not visit the church at this time and wait the required 14 days.

Confessions

As we struggle to get back to some sense of normalcy, the staff of St. Mary's has found a way to provide the Sacrament of Reconciliation that protects both the priest and the penitent with appropriate social distancing.

Please note that our procedure will provide confession face-to-face and will be by appointment only. You do NOT have to provide your name to come for confession.

To arrange a time to go to confession please call St. Mary's Emergency cell phone number at 201-696-2819.

You should also call this number if you have any sacramental emergency.

From the Pastor



It is with great joy that we welcome home the parishioners of St. Mary's this weekend as we resume Sunday masses. We do so with restrictions and limitations designed to help limit the spread of the corona virus that, in the past 3 months, has greatly altered the way we live our lives.

We ask that everyone follow the restrictions; that everyone wears a mask, that everyone respects social distancing and that those who are sick and those who are vulnerable refrain from attending. Please remember that Cardinal Tobin has continued the general dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend mass until further notice.

When I announced the resumption of mass last Sunday, I said that we were limited to only 50 people per mass. I added that we could have an additional 50 people in the lower church who could view mass on screen and who'll be able to receive communion. That means that we can have 100 people per mass. Hopefully by the time you read this, the limit will be raised to 100 people in the upper church and an additional 100 people in the lower church. To ensure that we do not exceed these limits, everyone needs to register in advance and enter the church by the side doors that we can check everyone in.

With each step we take back to some sense of normalcy, we learn from our mistakes. We learn what works and what does not. We will continue to make adjustments and we ask for your patience as we strive to meet the spiritual needs of all our parishioners.

With the resumption of mass, we can once again welcome everyone back to the Sacrament of Eucharist. The Eucharist will give us the nourishment we need as we learn to live in a world with Covid 19.
