

Parents should register for the Baptism Preparation Program at the rectory...even before the baby is born!

Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

God's Plan for Giving - Tithing

Tithing is God's plan to support His Church. Full tithing means 10% of gross income to God. We ask half of this, or 5%, for your parish Church. The other 5% goes to your favorite charities.

Masses:

Sunday Masses:

In order to attend Sunday Mass, you must make a reservation by calling the parish office at 201-384-0557 by 12:00noon on Friday or by emailing us at contactus@stmarysdumont.org.

You will receive confirmation of your reserved spot. Masses are at 5:30pm on Saturday, 7:45am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. We continue to live stream the 10:00am Mass on Sunday for those who are at home.

Daily Masses:

Our daily masses are at 7:00am and 8:45am Monday to Friday and 8:30am on Saturday. You don't need to make a reservation to attend our daily masses.

Guidelines:

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- Enter the church by way of the propped open side doors.
- All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.
- All visitors must maintain a 6-foot social distance from others at all times. Please sit only in designated pews. Members of the same household (living together) should sit together in designated areas. No one may sit in the marked off center of the pew.
- Please do not leave anything behind in the church such as tissues, papers, gloves, etc.
- If you are sick or have been I contact with someone who is sick, please do not visit the church at this time and wait the required 14 days.

PACT/Religious Education Updates

UPDATE: Celebration of the Sacraments

We have scheduled dates for First Holy Communion and Confirmation celebrations. At this time, families of candidates for the sacraments should have received a letter with the dates and times of these celebrations. If you have a child who was scheduled to receive the sacraments during the past Easter season and your family did not receive a letter, call us. Attendance at these sacramental celebrations is limited to the candidate and parents only (and one sponsor for Confirmation). These are socially distanced celebrations.

Our plan is to live stream all celebrations on our Facebook and YouTube channels for family members and others who will not be able to attend in person. These links will be e-mailed closer to the dates. We will also e-mail a link to a virtual walk-through/practice which will be scheduled for the Monday prior to these celebrations.

Religious Education/Fall 2020

As you likely know by now, all Catholic parishes in our Archdiocese of Newark (Bergen, Essex, Hudson, and Union counties) will be required to provide Religious Education without in-person classroom instruction for Fall, 2020. Resources are available to us which we hope will allow us to facilitate live events as well as guided online instruction experiences. This situation will continue to evolve, but we will incorporate several ways to keep our parish families and children current with their Religious Education.

Prayer gatherings and sacramental celebrations in the church building will strictly follow social distancing requirements as we have been doing for our Sunday liturgies.
