In order to attend Sunday Mass, you must make a reservation by calling the parish office at 201-384-0557 by 12:00noon on Friday or by emailing us at contactus@stmarysdumont.org.

You will receive confirmation of your reserved spot. Masses are at 5:30pm on Saturday, 7:45am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. We continue to live stream the 10:00am Mass on Sunday for those who are at home.

Daily Masses:

Our daily masses are at 7:00am and 8:45am Monday to Friday and 8:30am on Saturday. You don't need to make a reservation to attend our daily masses.

Guidelines:

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- Enter the church by way of the propped open side doors.
- All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.
- All visitors must maintain a 6-foot social distance from others at all times. Please sit only in designated pews. Members of the same household (living together) should sit together in designated areas. No one may sit in the marked off center of the pew.
- Please do not leave anything behind in the church such as tissues, papers, gloves, etc.
- If you are sick or have been I contact with someone who is sick, please do not visit the church at this time and wait the required 14 days.

From the Pastor

Once a year, the Archdiocese instructs pastors to give a report to the parishioners on the financial health of the parish. As you can see from the report, financially, this has not been a great year for St. Mary's. The covid crisis that has affected every facet of our normal lives has had a serious impact on our budget. Not only have we struggled with the effect of the pandemic, we have also been dealing with the repair costs associated with last year's flood in the school building.

However, all things considered, St. Mary's is keeping its head above water and this only because of the generous support of our parishioners and for that, I am truly grateful. Because of the pandemic lockdown, we missed major collections on Palm Sunday and Easter. We also were forced to cancel the Carnival; our most important annual fund raising event. We have had a couple of small fund raisers and we were fortunate that we qualified for a loan/grant from the federal government's covid relief program. And with vaccines on the near horizon, we look forward to a new year with renewed hope that things will slowly start returning to normal.

In an effort to get our parish on a firmer financial footing, we had decided to hold a raffle to replace the one missed when we were forced to cancel the carnival. By now, most parishioners have received raffle tickets in the mail. We ask that you purchase what you can afford. If possible, sell others to friends and neighbors. I know many people give lottery tickets at Christmas. Consider giving a raffle ticket instead. We all need to be a little creative as we strive to make this special raffle a great success. If you need more raffle tickets, they are available at the Rectory.

Like so many of you, I am looking forward to the end of this incredibly difficult year. But with the end so near, let us not lower our guard. We must continue to do what we can to limit the spread of this incredibly serious virus by avoiding crowds, practicing social distancing and wearing masks. As we move forward, I ask everyone to prayerfully consider how to best help St. Mary's through the financial difficulties created by the covid crisis.


