Sunday Masses:

In order to attend Sunday Mass, you must make a reservation by calling the parish office at 201-384-0557 by 12:00noon on Friday or by emailing us at contactus@stmarysdumont.org.

You will receive confirmation of your reserved spot. Masses are at 5:30pm on Saturday, 7:45am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. We continue to live stream the 10:00am Mass on Sunday for those who are at home.

Daily Masses:

Our daily masses are at 7:00am and 8:45am Monday to Friday and 8:30am on Saturday. You don't need to make a reservation to attend our daily masses.

Guidelines:

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- Enter the church by way of the propped open side doors.
- All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.
- ◆ All visitors must maintain a 6-foot social distance from others at all times. Please sit only in designated pews. Members of the same household (living together) should sit together in designated areas. No one may sit in the marked off center of the pew.
- Please do not leave anything behind in the church such as tissues, papers, gloves, etc.
- If you are sick or have been I contact with someone who is sick, please do not visit the church at this time and wait the required 14 days.

From the Pastor

When parents bring a child to church for baptism, it is a great family celebration. But it is also a parish celebration because our parish and the Church Universal are made richer and stronger by each new member. That is why; here at St. Mary's, baptisms are usually celebrated as part of a Sunday celebration of mass. The entire parish celebrates with the family as the parish welcomes its newest members.

Like so many other things, the covid pandemic has forced us to alter the way we celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism. When the pandemic started, all baptisms, with the exception of emergencies, were postponed. Since we have resumed celebrating the sacrament, it is usually done in a private ceremony on Sunday after the last mass. Usually, it is only one or two children at a time.

Hopefully, as we move out of this pandemic, we will be able to resume the celebration of Baptism during Sunday mass. I think it's extremely important not only for the chance to celebrate with the family of the newly baptized but also it calls to mind our own baptism at which we received the gift of the Holy Spirit and became part of the Body of Christ.

Today, as we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord, let us remember the promises that we made on our behalf at our own baptism and let us strive to more fully live out our baptismal call to be heralds of the Good News of Salvation. With the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, the Christmas season comes to an end. As we enter into Ordinary Time, let us remember that there is nothing ordinary about God's love for us and that we are called to reflect that love in all we say and do.
