

In order to attend Sunday Mass, you must make a reservation by calling the parish office at 201-384-0557 by 12:00noon on Friday or by emailing us at contactus@stmarysdumont.org.

You will receive confirmation of your reserved spot. Masses are at 5:30pm on Saturday, 7:45am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. We continue to live stream the 10:00am Mass on Sunday for those who are at home.

Daily Masses:

Our daily masses are at 7:00am and 8:45am Monday to Friday and 8:30am on Saturday. You don't need to make a reservation to attend our daily masses.

Guidelines:

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- Enter the church by way of the propped open side doors.
- All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.
- All visitors must maintain a 6-foot social distance from others at all times. Please sit only in designated pews. Members of the same household (living together) should sit together in designated areas. No one may sit in the marked off center of the pew.
- Please do not leave anything behind in the church such as tissues, papers, gloves, etc.
- If you are sick or have been I contact with someone who is sick, please do not visit the church at this time and wait the required 14 days.

From the **Pastor**

Each year, thousands march in Washington to mark the anniversary of the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion in this country. The Knights of Columbus have always strongly supported this event and have chartered buses to transport marchers to Washington so that members of our community can give witness to our belief that life begins at conception and that all human life is a precious gift from God.

This year, the march will be held on Friday, January 29th but because of the Covid pandemic it will be a very different event. I strongly encourage everyone to participate in this year's "Virtual March" through the <u>marchforlife.org</u> website. It is a safe way to participate and to show our support for the dignity of life.

In recent years, many states have worked to establish laws to limit access to abortion as a means of negating the Roe v Wade decision. With recent changes in the Supreme Court, many hope that the Roe v. Wade will soon be overturned and that abortion will once again be illegal in this country.

It is important to remember that abortion in this country did not start with Roe v Wade and abortions will not end if the laws are changed. As important as it is to change laws, it is much more important to change hearts and minds. Until everyone acknowledges the sanctity of all human life, from conception to natural death, abortions in this country will continue.

I find it extremely ironic that at the same time people work to enact laws to stop abortions, others work to promote laws that permit physician assisted suicide, euthanasia and the death penalty. If we want to claim the mantle of Pro-Life, we must respect and protect all human life.

This past year, as hundreds of thousands have died because of the covid crisis, we have all been forced to confront the fragility of human life. May the pro-life events of this week call us all to pray for that hearts and minds will be changed and may this pro-life events challenge us to do what we can to protect all human life from conception to natural death.

38 years ago, back in 1983, some parishioners with the approval of Msgr. Gilhooly and under the supervision of Fr. Szelest came together to create St. Mary's Food pantry.

Those people were:

Cathy Bannon, Helen Choinacki, Mary Cannon, Nancy Florio, Anna Markert, Dorothy Nicholson and Betty Walters.

For 38 years the St. Mary's food pantry has fed the hungry. Anna Markert has served as the director and coordinator for most of those years, and Nancy Florio continues to be a faithful volunteer.

The food pantry has served thousands of people during the past 38 years and often worked with Dumont social services and other agencies in the area.

In 2019, Nicholas Alloca, grandson of one of the founding members, Cathy Bannon refurbished the pantry for his Eagle Scout Project. You will all have the opportunity to see Nicholas's work after Mass today.

This year, Anna turned over the reins to Lynne Vietri and Denise Alloca, mother of Nick and Cathy Bannon's daughter. They, along with a number of volunteers, have kept the pantry running and fed hundreds during this time of Covid-19, and they work continuously with the Dumont Schools and town food pantry to assist them in their efforts as well. They depend heavily on the support of the people of St. Mary's who have been so generous.
