Due to Covid-19, The Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome has issued guidelines for the distribution of Ashes. The basic change is that ashes will be sprinkled on top of the head in silence, not placed on the forehead as is our usual custom. The guidelines are as follows:

NOTE ON ASH WEDNESDAY DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES IN TIME OF PANDEMIC

"The priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he <u>addresses all those present and only once</u> says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general:

"Repent and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return".

The priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him, sprinkling on the heads of each one without saying anything."

From the Pastor

I recently asked a friend what he was giving up for Lent this year and he said, "Haven't we already given up enough." I'm sure many people feel the same. <u>President's Day – February 15</u>

The parish office will be closed on Monday, Feb. 15 in observance of President's Day.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2021 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 21 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 30, 2021.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a uear.
