



As we celebrate Palm Sunday of Our Lord's Passion, we remember Our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem as we enter into the holiest week of the Church calendar. Last year, due to covid, we celebrated the Palm Sunday liturgy in an almost empty church. This year, we are able to gather as a community of faith to celebrate Palm Sunday and the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum but adjustments need to be made to reduce the risk of exposure to the covid virus.

In the interest of social distancing, no processions are permitted on Palm Sunday or the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum. There will be no foot washing on Holy Thursday and no touching or kissing of the Cross on Good Friday. The Archdiocese has given us explicit instructions about what can and cannot be done. But what is essential will remain.

The past year has brought many serious challenges and we have all had to make adjustments to protect ourselves and our loved ones. Many members of our parish have gotten sick and have struggled to beat the covid virus. Sadly, too many people have died. But this year we enter Holy Week filled with hope because vaccines mean we are closer than ever to beating covid for good.

During this Holy Week, as we celebrate the great events that give our life meaning and give us hope in eternal salvation, let us continue to play our part in working to beat covid by following all the rules and getting a vaccine when we are able. Please remember, it's essential that you register in advance to attend the liturgies of Holy Week and, if you are unable to join us here at Church, please join us via the live-stream.


