Parish Re-Engagement and Offertory Program

In April, all pastors received a notification from the Archdiocese about a new initiative called "Parish Re-Engagement and Offertory Program." I want to share with everyone what we received from the Archdiocese.

The last few years have been challenging times for all. We experienced and have been impacted by the pandemic as well as the most recent situation in the Ukraine. To that end, we remain hopeful and believe that the power of the Holy Spirit will always guide us through the present and the future.

There are also the economic realities for our parishes. While the Sunday collection levels will vary from parish to parish, we must continue to be prudent and to be good stewards of our resources. Now serves as a good opportunity to share the local story of our parish communities and to engage parishioners about the local mission and relevancy of our parishes.

*In an effort to unite money and mission, the Office of Development and Stewardship created and will facilitate a **Parish Re-Engagement and Offertory Program** for parishes in the Archdiocese of Newark.*

As part of this initiative, all registered parishioners of St. Mary's will soon receive a letter from the Archdiocese inviting them to respond to the our parish's need for increased giving. All funds collected through this effort are entirely for St. Mary's.

In these difficult economic times, each of us must prayerfully decide how to best use our limited resources; especially those who live on a fixed income. This Archdiocesan initiative invites each of us to consider how we can best use the gifts our generous God has given us.

Let me take this opportunity to thank everyone at St. Mary's for the many ways you support our parish. I know how blessed I am to be pastor of such an incredible parish.

On Care for Our Common Home

(This is the eighth in a series of articles on Laudato Si')

The Gospel of Creation

In the second chapter of Laudato Si' Pope Francis makes a religious and moral argument for protecting the environment. He is not the first pope to do so. Pope St. John Paul II stated in his message for World Peace on January 1, 1990:

I should like to address directly my brothers and sisters in the Catholic Church, in order to remind them of their serious obligation to care for all creation. The commitment of believers to a healthy environment for everyone stems directly from their belief in God the Creator, from their recognition of the effects of original and personal sin, and from the certainty of having been redeemed by Christ. Respect for life and for the dignity of the human person extends also to the rest of creation, which is called to join man in praising God (cf. Ps 148:96).

Pope Francis in Laudato Si' quoting Pope John Paul II, states that Christians "realize that their responsibility within creation, and their duty toward nature and the Creator, are an essential part of their faith." Pope Francis continues, "It is good for humanity and the world at large when we believers recognize the ecological commitments which stem from our convictions."

Several times the Pope emphasizes that all life, and particularly human life, is a gift from the Creator, to be cherished and cared for. He quotes the Canadian bishops, who pointed out that no creature is excluded from this manifestation of God: "From panoramic vistas to the tiniest living form, nature is a constant source of wonder and awe. It is also a continuing revelation of the divine." The Japanese bishops are quoted as saying, "To sense each creature singing the hymn of its existence is to live joyfully in God's love and hope."
