### Sacrament Preparation Programs at St. Marv's

Children of our parish who attend our PACT/Religious Education Program or a Catholic school come together for separate preparation to receive the sacraments of First Holy Communion (Eucharist) First Penance (Reconciliation/Confession) and Confirmation. Letters are being sent to parents regarding upcoming information meetings. Children do not automatically approach the sacraments if they are in a certain age or grade, but are prepared for sacraments as they develop a relationship with the Lord in his community, our Church.


