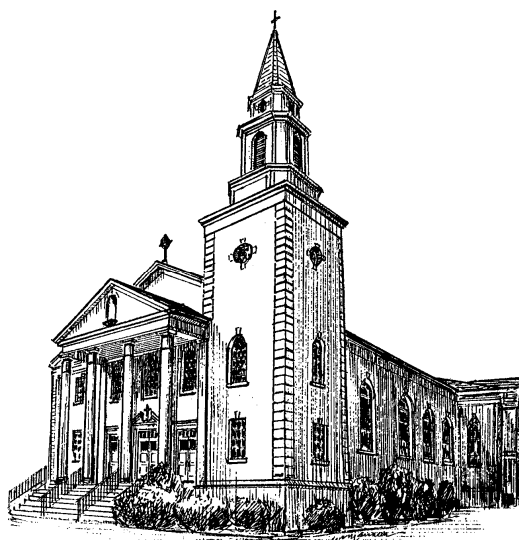

Dear Parish Family,


