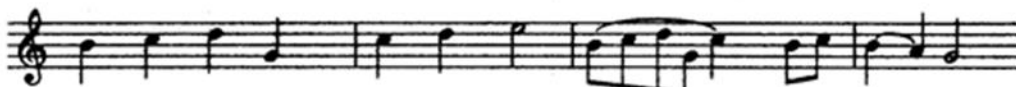

Jn 20:1-9



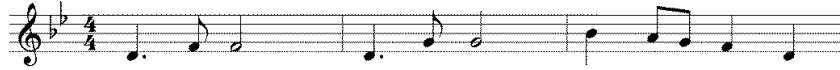
