## Stewardship Reflection

#### Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

"As they were marching out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they pressed into service to carry his cross." MATTHEW 27:32

The Lord calls us to love God and to love our neighbor. Every day we are presented with opportunities to love our neighbor and help him "carry his cross." These opportunities aren't usually big events, they are usually ordinary occurrences like helping someone carry their groceries or holding the door open for them. The key is putting the other person's needs before our own and not expecting anything in return.



Today, as we remember Our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem, we enter into the holiest week of the Church calendar. We are invited to cheer with the crowds that hail as king Jesus of Nazareth. We must also acknowledge that we also stand with the crowds that call for his crucifixion.

Our celebration of Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord is just the first of the great liturgies of this Holy Week. On Holy Thursday, we will celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper in which will recall the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Ordained Priesthood. On Good Friday, we will join together for the Veneration of the Cross, the instrument of our Lord's Passion and the source of our salvation. All of this will lead us to the celebration of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening. This is the most important liturgy of the Church year as we celebrate our Lord's triumph over death for all times.

These three liturgies of Sacred Triduum are very much like the three separate acts of one great play. If you are able to do so, I would encourage everyone to be part of these great liturgies in which we remember the great events that give our life meaning and give us hope in eternal life. You are also invited to attend the Stations of the Cross as presented by our Youth Group on Good Friday evening. As we prepare to celebrate the great mystery of our salvation, I ask that you pray for our catechumens and for our candidates who, through the sacraments of Church, will be fully initiated into the Body of Christ this Easter.

#### **First Communion Preparation**



May 7, 2023 3:00 PM 5 years & 25 years (All counties)

It is our desire that every couple in the Archdiocese deserving of such recognition be present at the appropriate liturgy. The presence of a large number of couples will be a tender witness to the strength and stability of Christian marriage in today's society.

Since they we were unable to host these celebrations in 2020 and 2021, and many families are still playing 'catch up' with their celebrations, any couple who would have celebrated their Silver or Gold Anniversary in those years can also join them. Please note, whether the milestone anniversary took place in 2020, 2021 or 2022, the certificates will still say Silver or Gold, not 26, 51 etc.

If you would like to participate in one of these liturgies, you need to come to the parish office and fill in a registration form so that they know the names and the number of those attending each liturgy.
