For who is able to govern this vast people of yours?"

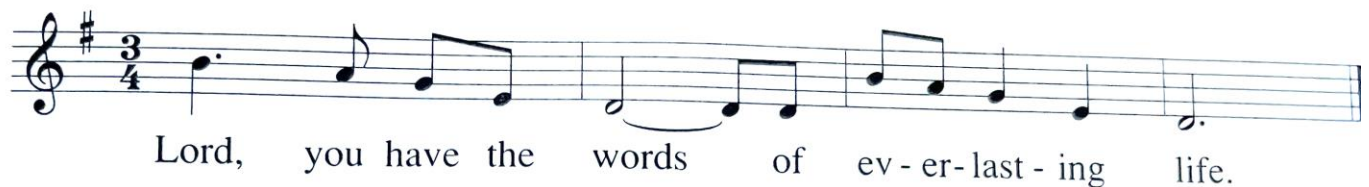
The LORD was pleased that Solomon made this request.
