Brothers and sisters: You know what sort of people we were among you for your sake. When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law tested him by asking, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Homily






