

### Stewardship Reflection

#### First Sunday of Advent

"Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." - MARK 13:33

We all take things for granted. In particular, we take time for granted. We make our lives too busy. We plan our days, weeks, months, even years in advance. Remember, our time on earth is a gift. None of us knows how long we will be here. Start today and begin thanking God for each and every day. Take time in silence, every day, and listen to how God is calling you right now to help build His kingdom on earth.



Some stores started selling Christmas decorations in early October. A couple of satellite radio stations started playing Christmas music the day after Halloween and I've already received my first Christmas card. It seems that every year, so many people try to start the Christmas season earlier and earlier and then, the day after Christmas, it's all over.

We seem to have it all backwards. Today we celebrate the first Sunday of Advent. It is the beginning of the season of Advent, not the Christmas season. It is a time to prepare for the coming of Christ among us. But all too often, we are so busy sending cards, wrapping gifts and decorating everything in sight that we have no time to think about what we are really getting ready for.


