Stewardship Reflection

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?" - JOHN 1:38

When we recognize who we are, it's easier to find what we are looking for. Once we see ourselves, and others, as children of God, we spend less time looking for the material comforts of the world. Instead, our hearts long for something deeper that can only be filled by God. Ask God daily how He wants you to live the life He intended for you.



On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court of the United Stated handed down the Roe v Wade decision which legalized abortion in this nation. For the past 50 years, thousands have gathered in Washington, D.C. for the annual March for Life to protest this decision and to uphold our belief in the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death.

A year and half ago, the Supreme Court issued a new decision which vacated the Roe decision leaving the question of the legality of an abortion to the laws of each individual state. Since then, some states have adopted strict draconian laws prohibiting all abortions while other states are working to ensure abortion as a legal option. This patchwork of state laws has caused mass confusion and heated debate regarding this issue. In the midst of this debate, on Friday, January 19th, thousands will march in Washington, D.C. to give witness to our belief that all human life is sacred.

I think it is most important to remember that abortion in this country did not start with Roe v Wade and abortions will not end even if all the laws are changed. As important as it is to change laws, it is much more important to change hearts and minds. Until everyone acknowledges the sanctity of all human life, from conception to natural death, abortions will continue.

I find it extremely ironic that at the same time people work to enact laws to stop abortions, others work to promote laws that permit physician assisted suicide, euthanasia, and the death penalty. If we want to claim the mantle of Pro-Life, we must respect and protect all human life.

If we are truly followers of Christ, we must work to promote a culture of life where all human life is respected and nurtured. This must include the poor, the homeless, the sick and the marginalized in our society. We need to pray for world where no child goes to bed hungry and no elder person is neglected. Until every individual is respected as a child of God, our work in promoting a culture of life is not finished.
