

## 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties." - 1 CORINTHIANS 7:32

How much anxiety do we bring upon ourselves by constantly worrying about not having enough or attaining more things? God won't necessarily give you everything you want, but He will provide everything you need. Try this – use the word "pray" instead of the word "worry" in the future. Then spend your time praying instead of worrying.

In many ways, Catholic schools have change much since I attended St. Stephen's School in Kearny, NJ. When I was in eighth grade, there were 3 classes each with more than 25 students. This was true of all the grades in our school because being Catholic meant you went to a Catholic School. At that time, there were two other Catholic Schools in the same town.

I fear those days are long gone. So many Catholic schools in our Archdiocese, like St. Mary's, closed many years ago. For several years, the Archdiocese used a co-sponsorship model for Catholic schools. During which time, St. Mary's joined with St. John's in Bergenfield and Ascension in New Milford to form Transfiguration Academy. But now, even Transfiguration Academy is closed. It appears that the concept of Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Newark has come to an end.

But not quite yet; there are still 17 Catholic grammar schools here in Bergen County and there are 8 Catholic high schools. These schools survive of the quality of education that they provide. It is an education that is balanced with strong moral development and an emphasis on spiritual growth.

This week we kick-off Catholic Schools Week. It is a chance to celebrate the many ways in which Catholic schools contribute to our Church and our community. Again, I encourage all those with school-aged children to consider one of the remaining Catholic school in our Archdiocese and I encourage everyone to support the values of a Catholic education.




