

### FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT



Next Sunday is the official feast day of St. Patrick but because of the Bergen County Parade, we will celebrate St. Patrick today. Let's say we will begin the celebration of St. Patrick today as we welcome the dignitaries who lead today's Bergen County St. Patrick's Day parade.

In this country, the celebration of St. Patrick's Day has become more than the celebration of a 5<sup>th</sup> century bishop and has instead become a celebration of all things Irish. As we celebrate this remarkable man, I think it is important to remember who St. Patrick was and how he worked to establish the Catholic faith in Ireland.

Details about Patrick life are extremely limited but from the two writings he left us, we know that he was born in Britain and, at the age of 16, he was captured by Irish raiders who took him to Ireland where he lived in captivity for 6 years. As Patrick states in his "Confession," it was during this captivity that he experienced a spiritual awaken that led him, after his escape, to return to Ireland as a missionary.

Early medieval tradition credits St. Patrick with being the first bishop of Armagh and Primate of Ireland and, while evidence indicates that he was not the first missionary to bring Christianity to the island, he certainly worked tirelessly to spread the Gospel and is honored for his efforts to convert all of Ireland to the Christian faith.

As we remember how hard St. Patrick worked to spread the Gospel in Ireland, we must remember that, as followers of Christ, we are called to do the same. Let us look to St. Patrick as our inspiration so that in our families, in our workplaces and in our community, we may witness the Good News of Salvation and proclaim our faith in Jesus Christ.


