Stewardship Reflection

10th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand.” - MARK 3:24

Within your parish community, do your ministries collaborate with each other or do they compete against each other? Do your parish ministries work for the greater glory of God or do they work for the glory of the people running them? The primary goal of parish ministry is not to increase Mass attendance, increase the number of volunteers or increase offertory. The primary goal is to be one Body of Christ that helps people take one step closer to Jesus. If it's not doing that, it's not worth doing.



Each year, every parish in the diocese is asked to participate in the Co-operative Mission Appeal. Next weekend, our parish will welcome Fr. Romeo Salami, SDB who will speak on behalf of the Salesian Missions.

Salesian Missions is a U.S. based, nonprofit, Catholic organization working to raise funds for international programs that serve youth and families in poor communities around the globe. The Salesians are led by nearly 30,000 priests, brothers and sisters who serve as Salesians of Don Bosco (S.D.B.), the second largest order in the Roman Catholic Church.

Fr. Romeo Salami comes to us from Mali where he currently serves as the Provincial Director of the Planning and Development Office of AON Province, which consists of Benin, Burkina Faso, Gambia, Guinea Conakry, and Senegal. In this position, he works with eighteen Salesian communities in six countries to identify their needs and successfully fundraise for their programs.

Some of the world-wide efforts of the Salesian Missions include Youth Education and Trade Schools, Health & Medical Services, Emergency Relief Programs, Family Assistance and Development for Women, Homeless Youth, Refugee Camps and Displaced Populations and Food Security Programs. 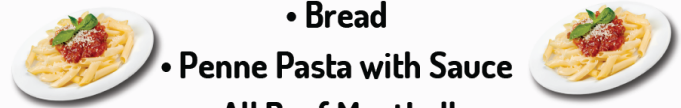
