

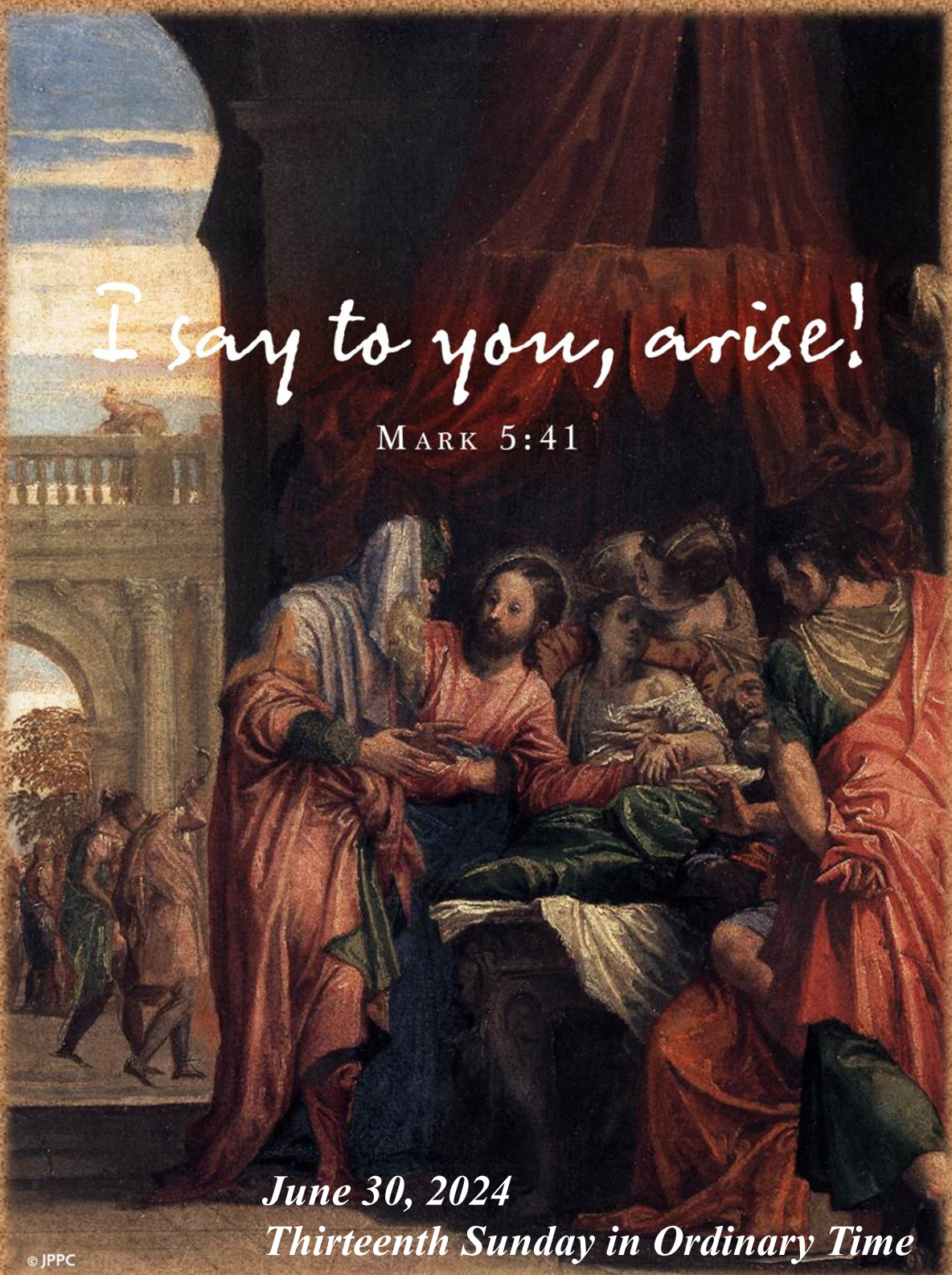

In the summer of 1776, a small group of men, representatives of the 13 British colonies in the new world, gathered in Philadelphia to discuss, debate and argue over the future of the land they called home. To some, what they considered was an act of high treason. To others, it was foolhardy. Today, we look back on their actions and call it patriotism. This week, we celebrate what they did on July 4th of that year as they signed a document that clearly stated that, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

In the 248 years that have passed since that day, we have learned that heroes come in many different forms. Each year, as we celebrate Independence Day, we honor the countless men and women who have donned the uniforms of our nation's armed forces to protect and defend the ideal enumerated in that document. After 9/11, we honored the first responders of the police, the EMS and the fire departments. The covid crisis taught us to give thanks to the medical personnel and other essential workers who risked their health and their very lives to help the rest of us get through a pandemic lock down. Independence Day reminds us, that as a nation, how truly blessed we are with countless men and women who are willing to give their all to ensure that our nation will overcome any and all difficulties.

In 1790, George Washington pointed out that "The establishment of our new Government seemed to be the last great experiment for promoting human happiness." For this Great Experiment to thrive, we must all recommit ourselves to the ideals enshrined in that document signed by our nation's founding fathers. We must work to make it a reality for everyone who lives in this great land.

Are You Registered?

If you have recently moved or even if you have been attending for years, stop by the parish office and register.

Why do you need to register?

There are many reasons such as:

- There's a feeling of becoming part of the parish community.
• You give the parish a chance to get to know you better.
• The parish will have a way to communicate with you by sending you emails or mails to keep you up-to-date on the parish news.
• Registration is required to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation or Penance, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and Holy Matrimony.
• If you're planning to register your child(ren) to our Religious Education program, the families of those attending must be registered parishioners.
• When a person has been asked to be a Godparent or sponsor or if a parish needs verification of your status as a practicing Catholic, these can't be done if you're not registered. You need to be registered as an active parishioner for at least three months.

Registering is easy. Come to the parish office and register! Office hours are Monday - Thursday, 9:00am -5:00pm, Friday 9:00am-3:00pm and closed for lunch 1:00pm - 2:00pm.

Turkey and Syria are situated in a region that experiences frequent, major earthquakes. In early February 2023, central Turkey's most powerful earthquake since 1939 struck with a magnitude of 7.8. More than 10,000 aftershocks continued for weeks afterward, including a powerful magnitude 6.4 aftershock that struck the biblical city of Antioch, known as Antakya. More than 50,000 people in Turkey and neighboring Syria were killed by the initial earthquake, followed by more deaths and the destruction of structures damaged by the first earthquake. UN officials estimated that more than 1.5 million people were left homeless in what is believed to be the largest natural disaster in Turkey's history.

In a mid-February meeting with Turkey's new ambassador to the Holy See, Pope Francis asked what sort of aid Turkey most needed. Within 24 hours, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, the papal almoner and prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for the Service of Charity, organized a shipment of canned food, diapers, thermal garments, and other necessities, to be sent from Rome to a warehouse in Turkey for distribution to those in need. At the same time, economic aid to Syrian victims was entrusted to the apostolic nunciature in Syria. In addition to this material relief, the Vatican's prefect for the Dicastery for the Eastern Churches, Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti, visited Syria and Turkey to provide a ministry of presence to victims.

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, the poor, and those affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by your contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you

participate in the collection, you join Catholics across the globe in supporting the pope's mission of mercy as well as the Holy See dicasteries that assist his ministry.
