

# Stewardship Reflection

## 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." MARK 8:34

Living a stewardship lifestyle means not only being responsible for my own life, but for the lives of others as well. We realize that our gifts are not intended for ourselves, rather they are meant to be shared with others. "Taking up my cross" means doing things when someone else needs me and not when it's convenient for me.



Shortly after I returned here to St. Mary's back in January of 2016, we joined parishes throughout the Archdiocese in a Capital Campaign called We are Living Stones. Part of the process as we joined this campaign was to identify projects that would benefit St. Mary's. All agreed that one thing that would truly benefit our parish and our parishioners would be an elevator. Thanks to PALAD, we do have an outside wheel-chair lift, but with age, this piece of equipment has become somewhat unreliable. What we really need is a real elevator.

Over the years, we have continued to raise funds for this project, we have developed plans, we have sought permission from the Archdiocese and we have had our plans approved by the town. We are finally ready to begin.

With the next couple of weeks, we hope to begin construction of the elevator. This new elevator will replace one of the stair cases on the Rectory side of the building (**not** the stair case with the wheel-chair lift). Of course, construction will begin with destruction of the current stair case.

During the construction of our new elevator, we will all suffer some minor inconveniences and we will probably lose a one or two parking space. I ask that everyone use extreme caution during this construction phase which will last 4-5 months.

This new elevator will finally make St. Mary's Church handicapped accessible and will serve the needs of parishioners for many years to come. Thank you to everyone who has made this project possible.
