No Holy Hour with Eucharistic Adoration on Nov. 1st



There will be **NO Holy Hour with Eucharistic** Adoration on Friday, November 1st, All Saints Day. It's a Holy Day of Obligation and we have a Mass at 7:30pm.



Carlo Acutis was born on May 3rd, 1991. He died from leukemia on October 12th, 2006 at the age of 15. Despite his incredibly short life, Carlo was an accomplished website designer who documented Eucharistic miracles and approved apparitions which he catalogued on a website he designed before his death. Carlo was noted for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and his devotion to the Eucharist, which became a core theme of his life. Carlo was beatified by Pope Francis on October 10th, 2020. After a second miracle attributed to the intercession of Carlo was confirmed in May 2024, Pope Francis granted approval in July 2024 to continue forward with the canonization process. It is expected that Carlo will be canonized as first millennial saint in the upcoming Jubilee year.

Every Sunday, when we make our Profession of Faith, we state that we believe in the Communion of Saints. We usually think of theses saints as great religious figure of the past. The canonization of Carlo Acutis reminds us that saints come in all shapes and sizes and that each generation is called to add to this great communion of saints.

This week we will celebrate the Feast of All Saints. But this Feast of All Saints is not just those who have been formally canonized; not just those we can name. We live in the hope that all those who have lived and died as faithful followers of Christ will receive the reward of eternity with our God. All Saints Day is for the countless men and women whose names are known to God alone who have received the gift of eternal salvation and from their place in paradise they intercede on our behalf before the throne of grace.

And as we pray with all those who have received the gift of eternal salvation, we pray for those who are still on the way. We pray for all the souls in Purgatory, those who left this life and are being prepared to enter into paradise. We share with them the hope that we too may join the Communion of Saints that stand before the throne of our loving God. We pray that all God's children may share in the beatific vision.

Our belief in the Communion of Saints reminds us that, as we read in our funeral services, "...the ties that bind us to one another do not unravel with death."


Altar Servers Needed!
