Stewardship Reflection

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all the burnt offerings and sacrifices." (MARK 12:33)

Of all the gifts that God gives us, the one He wants the most is our heart. He wants us to share out of our love for Him, not out of obligation. Using our talent in parish ministry and contributing money to support our parish mission is important, but it's more important to spend time in prayer with God daily and discern how He is calling us to be generous with <u>all</u> of our gifts. Not just the visible ones, but the invisible ones like love, mercy and forgiveness.



It has been a long and, at times, very uncivilized campaign period with a number of very unprecedented events. Many people have become very confused. Others have become disillusioned. Many are asking themselves what is true and what is not. Many have become so alienated by the process that they have decided not to participate in the upcoming elections. The US Bishops Conference reminds us that the Right to Vote is not only a privilege that we must never take for granted; it is an obligation that we as Catholic Christians must exercise.

The website of the US Bishops Conference has numerous resources that can help guide us in our responsibilities in the election process. We are reminded, that as voters, we must be informed voters. We must know all the issues that are important to us as Catholic Christians and as Americans, not just a select few. We must know where the candidates stand on these issues. We must judge the character of the candidates and trust in the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we make our choices.

We must also remember that we are not electing just a president. One third of the Senate and the entire House of Representatives will be chosen this election day. There will also be important choices to make on the State and Local levels.

As we go to the polls this Election Day we must remember that it is not about being a Republican or a Democrat. It is about being an Americans who are voting the best candidate of our nation and for our fellow Americans.
