Sanctuary Lamp: Apr. 27; Aug. 31



Last week, right after Ash Wednesday, a parishioner asked me if Catholics are still expected to fulfill their Easter Duty. The Easter Duty is a precept of the Church that says every good Catholic should receive communion at least once a year, preferably during the Easter season. The follow up question was, "Do I also have to go to confession first?"

The revised Code of Canon Law maintains that all the Catholics are bound by an obligation to confess serious sins at least once a year. Moreover, the Code also asserted, "It is to be recommended to the Christian faithful that venial sins also be confessed."

The strongest witness we can give of our awareness of our need for God's mercy is by going to Confession. Confession, or more appropriately, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, like all sacraments is a celebration of God's love. It is where we can hear the words that tell us that our sins are forgiven. It is where we are reminded that there is no sin we can commit that God cannot forgive. He loves us too much.

Hoping to make the Sacrament of Reconciliation more accessible, the priest of our deanery are joining together to host a series of Penance Services during Lent. St. Mary's will host the second Lenten Penance Service on Monday, March 24 at 7:00 pm. We will be joined by priests from neighboring parishes to hear confessions.

There are four more Penance Services at neighboring parishes. The schedule is as follows:

Monday, March 10, 7pm, St. Joseph, Oradell Saturday, March 29, 12:00Noon, St. John's, Bergenfield

Monday, March 31, 7pm, St. Therese, Cresskill Monday, April 7, 7pm, St. Peter's River Edge

We will continue to have our regularly scheduled Confessions on Saturday afternoon from 4 to 4:45 pm.

Hopefully, we will all avail ourselves of this healing sacrament during these 40 days of Lent. Lent is an opportunity to grow closer to God. The Sacrament of Reconciliation can help us achieve this goal.

Solidarity with Haiti

Saint Mary's is hoping to assist our sisters and brothers in Haiti by supporting the work of Beyond Borders. Beyond Borders, is a small non-profit organization that is working toward creating lasting change in Haiti. Some parishioners may recall a meeting back in April where we introduced Beyond Borders to our parish. This organization concentrates their efforts in three areas: rescuing children from domestic servitude, which is essentially slavery; developing local leaders; and assisting families living in extreme poverty to become self-sufficient and flourish.

St Mary's is specifically seeking to give assistance to this third effort of helping families to become selfsufficient and flourish by supporting the "Family Graduation Program."

The Family Graduation Program enrolls a family for 24 months, and during that time helps the family to become self-sufficient. This is accomplished by providing permanent shelter which the family helps build; providing a means to become self-sufficient by providing seeds for crops and animals to provide an income; and helping them become financially literate.

Donors commit \$100 a month to sponsor a family for the duration of the program. A few parishioners have already committed to sponsoring a family. As a parish we would like to sponsor a family. Periodically there will be a request for donations to allow this to happen, and to make this a truly parish -wide effort. We will be provided with information on the specific family that we sponsor and will make that information available to the parish.

If every person attending Mass donated \$1.00 when requested only three collections per year would be required. More information on Beyond Borders can be found at beyondborder.net or simply enter "Beyond Borders Haiti" in your search engine.


Project CHILD FIND is a free referral service and public awareness campaign to assist in the identification of youth with a delay or disability from birth through the age of 21.
