and I found delight in the human race."

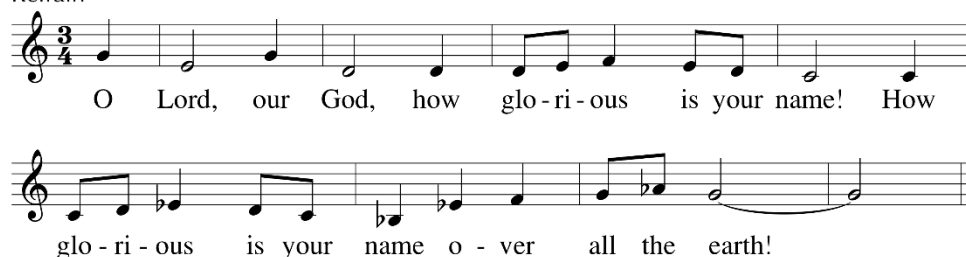



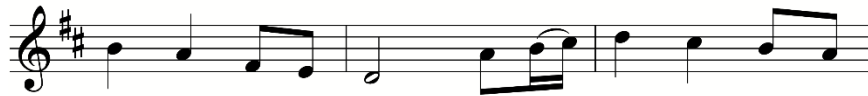
