

Pentecost Sunday

"The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." (JOHN 14:26)

The materialism of our society lures us to concentrate more on what we want than on what God wants for us. The relativism of our world tells us that we should be tolerant of all things, that there is no absolute truth. Pray to the Holy Spirit to transform our lives and to guide our thoughts, words and actions. What you put in your mind, heart, and soul affects your actions. Put good things in and good things will come out.

PENTECOST SUNDAY

JUNE 8, 2025



Jesus promised his disciples that He would send down upon them the gift of the Father. That they would be clothed with power from on high. They were to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit and this is what we celebrate on this great feast of Pentecost. In the power of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were no longer a fear-filled group of Jewish converts who believed that Jesus of Nazareth was the long awaited Messiah. In the reception of the Holy Spirit, they became the bold heralds of the Good News of Salvation. No longer would they hide behind locked doors. Instead they filled the streets with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. They were commissioned to spread the Word of God to the ends of the earth and the fact that, two thousand years later we celebrate this day, proves they succeeded.

The Gift of the Holy Spirit, received by the Apostles on Pentecost, was also given to you and me in the Waters of Baptism. This means that we too are commissioned to spread the Good News of Salvation. We may not have "the gift of tongues," but we have received so many other gifts. Our tradition teaches us that the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit are Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord. These are not just words we might remember from a religion class many years ago. These are gifts given to us so that we might build up the Church whose birth we celebrate today.

Jesus promised that in the power of the Holy Spirit, He would be with His Church always. As people who put their trust in the power of the Holy Spirit, we must believe that this same Spirit guided the College of Cardinals as they chose our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. We must always keep this new Pope in our prayers as he strives to guide our Church.

The Feast of Pentecost marks the end of the Easter season and the beginning of Ordinary time. We must always remember that there is nothing ordinary about God's love for us. In the power of God's love, personified in the Holy Spirit, we too are called to be bold heralds of the Good News of Salvation.

Letter of Appreciation for Sponsoring the Saintimond Family

Dear Parishioners of St. Mary's:

I am deeply grateful for your generous sponsorship of the Saintimond family. Your sponsorship is equipping them with the skills they need to escape extreme poverty—for good.

We are committed to ensuring that every family that graduates from Beyond Borders Family Graduation Program is able to maintain the gains they make thanks to sponsors like you.

To that end, in late 2024, our colleague Freda Catheus, co-coordinator of our Model Community Initiative on Lagonav Island, began visiting Family Graduation Program graduates to assess how they are doing and what strategic investments Beyond Borders can make to ensure their continued success.

So far, Freda's met with 390 families from the previous five cohorts, and her findings will guide next steps, such as additional training and capital for Village Savings and Loans, support for families facing economic hardships as a result of Haiti's ongoing political crisis, and helping families make repairs to their homes or resolve conflicts with landowners.

The Saintimond family will benefit from this kind of longer-term monitoring and evaluation after they graduate too, ensuring that they continue to thrive despite Haiti's persistent challenges.
