Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditional called Feast of Corpus Christi. Two months ago, on Holy Thursday, we celebrated the institution of the Eucharist. Today we celebrate the Real Presence of Christ in this Sacrament; we celebrate the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus in the Eucharist. In days gone by, large Eucharistic processions would be part of the celebration of this great feast.

This year, as we celebrate this feast perhaps we might recall the joy and wonder we felt when we received First Holy Communion. For me, this feast always reminds me of the countless times I have had the privilege of giving some Viaticum. Viaticum is given to someone who is dying. It is the last Communion a person received and it literally means "Food for the Journey."

Perhaps, every time we receive Holy Communion we should consider it Food for the Journey. We always need to remember, that on the journey of life Christ is always with us. In the Eucharist, we know we have the Real Presence of Christ.

Next weekend, St. Mary's participates in The Peter's Pence Collection. This annual collection is taken to support the charitable works of the Holy Father. The Peter's Pence Collection is a worldwide effort to support the most disadvantaged; the victims of war, oppression, natural disasters and all those in need of emergency assistance.

The Peter's Pence Collection has been part of the Church's history since the seventh century and was instrumental in spreading the Christian faith throughout Europe and beyond. It is traditionally taken up late June to coincide with the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul. The Peter's Pence collection is viewed as a gesture of solidarity through which every member of the faithful can participate in the activity of the Pope as Pastor of the universal Church.

The recent election of a Bishop from Chicago as our new Holy Father reminds us that we are part of something much bigger than a Church in Dumont, NJ. Our participation in the Peter's Pence Collection unites us in the work of Pope Leo XIV as the successor as St. Peter.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FOR OUR PARISH COMMUNITY

Dear Parish Community:

The Archdiocese of Newark has been notified that an individual named (Horacio) Daniel Medina has been falsely presenting himself as a Catholic priest in the northern New Jersey area where he is celebrating Mass in people's homes and then ministering confessions and blessing homes and religious articles. Mr. Medina was permanently removed from the clerical state by the Holy Father in 2013. As a result of the laicization, he is forbidden from wearing clerical dress and from functioning in any capacity as a priest. He is not authorized to celebrate the sacraments, including the Eucharist, or engage in any priestly ministry. Prior to his laicization, Mr. Medina was arrested and charged with child abuse. His name appears on the Archdiocese of Newark's list of credibly accused priests. We urge both clergy and the faithful to refrain from participating in any further attempt by Mr. Medina to offer the Mass or administer other sacraments. We strongly encourage that any such activity be reported immediately to the Archdiocese of Newark at 973-497-4254. We ask that all the faithful join in prayer that Christ may bring healing and hope to anyone who has been abused by a priest or by anyone in the Catholic Church. Any person who wishes to report an incident of abuse or misconduct committed by a member of the Archdiocese of Newark is urged to immediately inform their County Prosecutor or other law enforcement office as well as the Archdiocese's Department for the Protection of the Faithful. 


Food Pantry Items For June

Are You Registered?

If you have recently moved or even if you have been attending for years, stop by the parish office and register. Registering is easy.

Why do you need to register?

There are many reasons such as:

- There's a feeling of becoming part of the parish community.
- You give the parish a chance to get to know you better.
- The parish will have a way to communicate with you by sending you emails or mails to keep you up-to-date on the parish news.
- Registration is required to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation or Penance, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and Holy Matrimony.
- If you're planning to register your child(ren) to our religious education program, the families of those attending must be registered parishioners.
- When a person has been asked to be a Godparent or sponsor or if a parish needs verification of your status as a practicing Catholic, these can't be done if you're not registered. You need to be registered as an active parishioner for at least three months.
