



Now that we have celebrated the 4th of July, we can all relax and enjoy a quiet summer when not much happens and we can all take it a little bit easier.

Well, not all of us. It may be summer but that doesn't mean that there isn't a lot to do. We will use this time to address a number of needed repairs in the Church, the Rectory and in the School. At the same time, there is the constant need to deal with the ongoing issues like lawn maintenance.

Hopefully, by the time you read this, our new elevator is operational. The elevator is finished and ready to use but we cannot use it until the emergency alarm and fire alarm systems are properly approved and inspected. This has been a great source of frustration for several weeks.

The other major source of frustration for us has been the tenants in our school building. Like a large percentage of parishes in our Archdiocese, rental income from our closed school buildings is an essential part of budget. GLO, an early childhood program that rented the lower level of our school abruptly terminated their lease resulting in an extremely large deficit in our budget. We are currently working with some potential new tenants. I ask that you pray that we can reach an agreement with one of these potential tenants before September.

I also ask everyone to remember that so often, summer months brings lower collections but not lower bills. Keeping our large church air conditioned is a very expensive proposition.

I pray that everyone finds some time this summer to rest and relax. It is important for everyone to step out of the regular busyness of daily life and recharge ourselves for what lies ahead. So whether it is some quiet time at the beach or some exciting trip to some wonderful destination, I hope and pray that everyone finds some time this summer for a little vacation. And just remember, just because things seem quiet, there is always something happening here at St. Mary's.

Are You Registered?

If you have recently moved or even if you have been attending for years, stop by the parish office and register.

Why do you need to register?

There are many reasons such as:

- There's a feeling of becoming part of the parish community.
- You give the parish a chance to get to know you better.
- The parish will have a way to communicate with you by sending you emails or mails to keep you up-to-date on the parish news.
- **Registration is required** to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation or Penance, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and Holy Matrimony.
- If you're planning to register your child(ren) to our **Religious Education program**, the families of those attending must be registered parishioners.
- When a person has been asked to be a Godparent or sponsor or if a parish needs verification of your status as a practicing Catholic, these **can't be done if you're not registered**. <u>You need to be registered as an active parishioner for at least three months.</u>

Registering is easy. Come to the parish office and register! Office hours are Monday - Thursday, 9:00am -5:00pm, Friday 9:00am-3:00pm and closed for lunch 1:00pm - 2:00pm.

1. Type the link:

- 2. Click on the Sign In tab.
- 3. Click on Create One to set-up an account. (Look at the bottom of the screen.)
- 4. Fill out the form and click register.
- 5. Click on the Give Now tab.
- 6. Select the collection of your choice
- 7. Set-up your donation amount, payment type and frequency.
