

This Wednesday, August 6th, our parish will begin a special Novena that will end as we celebrate our patronal feast; the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This Novena demonstrates our devotion to Mary and our trust that she will always intercede on behalf of her children.

As the statue in lower church makes abundantly clear, for a very long time our parish has been dedicated to Our Lady of the Assumption. This magnificent statue of Our Blessed Mother represents the heritage of our parish and gives us our patronal feast.

The feast of the Assumption is all about hope. Mary, the only human conceived without the stain of original sin, was assumed body and soul into the glory of heaven. In our profession of faith, we state that we believe that at the end of time, in the resurrection of the dead, all those souls that have been saved through the gratuitous mercy of our loving God will be reunited with the body they left in this world. Mary is the first to share in this promise. It is our hope that in God's love, we will all share in this eternal glory.

Where Mary has gone, we all hope to follow. She leads us by her example of complete surrender to the will of God. She intercedes for our needs as she mediates the love of her precious Son. We strive, as best we can, we pray as best we can, we hope as best we can – and we trust. We trust in Our Father's Love and in a Mother's pray.

On the Feast of the Assumption, Friday, August 15th, in addition to our morning masses, we will celebrate a special mass is the evening at 7:30. Afterwards, all are invited to join us for an Ice Cream Social in the prayer garden behind the rectory. This year, Feast of the Assumption is a holyday of obligation. So, we are all obligated to attend mass, hopefully, we will all attend the Ice Cream Social.

Are You Registered?

If you have recently moved or even if you have been attending for years, stop by the parish office and register.

Why do you need to register?

There are many reasons such as:

- There's a feeling of becoming part of the parish community.
- You give the parish a chance to get to know you better.
- The parish will have a way to communicate with you by sending you emails or mails to keep you up-to-date on the parish news.
- **Registration is required** to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation or Penance, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and Holy Matrimony.
- If you're planning to register your child(ren) to our **Religious Education program**, the families of those attending must be registered parishioners.
- When a person has been asked to be a Godparent or sponsor or if a parish needs verification of your status as a practicing Catholic, these can't be done if you're not registered. You need to be registered as an active parishioner for at least three months.

Registering is easy. Come to the parish office and register! Office hours are Monday - Thursday, 9:00am -5:00pm, Friday 9:00am-3:00pm and closed for lunch 1:00pm - 2:00pm.

- 4. Fill out the form and click register.
- 5. Click on the Give Now tab.
- 6. Select the collection of your choice
- 7. Set-up your donation amount, payment type and frequency.

Once you set-up your account, donations will automatically deduct from your account. If you need to make a change in your donation, simply go the link and make the adjustment. It's that simple!
