Gun Violence Incidents in 2025

Last Sunday St. Mary's marked the 13th anniversary of the shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School, which claimed the lives of 20 children, six staff members, the mother of the shooter and the shooter.

Gun violence is not confined to mass shootings, or even intentional shootings. If not handled or stored properly, firearms often lead to injuries and, sometimes, death. Like all shootings, lives are changed forever.

In 2024 there were 1,462 incidents of accidental shootings. Attaching a name and an age makes the incident more than a statistic - and may break our heart. Below are a few of the incidents that occurred this year.

Gregory Zecca accidently shot and killed his 13-yearold son in Naples, Florida on July 19. ●On July 7 a three-year-old was seriously wounded by the accidental discharge of a firearm by a 13-year-old in a relative's house, in Mims, Brevard County, Florida (the child is expected to recover). •A 4-year-old boy, Chosen Morris, died on February 12 after accidentally shooting himself in the head with a handgun he found in his parents' car in Davenport, Florida. •On March 21 a 23-year-old woman in Lakeland, Florida was injured after a gun went off while her 19-year-old friend was handling it. ●At the Florida Mall, Orange County, on February 16 there was an accidental discharge of a firearm as a man in his 20's adjusted his weapon and injured himself. • Daryvan Kvon Spell, 31, of Jacksonville, Florida, was charged with child neglect and culpable negligence after his son, a 2-year-old, accidently shot himself in the head while playing with a handgun he found in the drawer of a nightstand as his mother slept. He died Easter Sunday, April 20. •On May 14, Joselyn Esparza, 15, of South Dallas, Texas, accidently shot herself with a gun brought home by her 14-year-old brother while recording a social media video.

"As bishops, we support measures that control the sale and use of firearms and make them safer -especially efforts that prevent their unsupervised use by children or anyone other than the owner -and we reiterate our call for sensible regulation of handguns." Stewardship Reflection


4th Sunday of Advent "When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home." MATTHEW 1:24

Are You Registered?

If you have recently moved or even if you have been attending for years, stop by the parish office and register.

Why do you need to register?

There are many reasons such as:

- There's a feeling of becoming part of the parish community.
- You give the parish a chance to get to know you better.
- The parish will have a way to communicate with you by sending you emails or mails to keep you up-to-date on the parish news.
- **Registration is required** to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation or Penance, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and Holy Matrimony.
- If you're planning to register your child(ren) to our **Religious Education program**, the families of those attending must be registered parishioners.
- When a person has been asked to be a Godparent or sponsor or if a parish needs verification of your status as a practicing Catholic, these **can't be done if you're not registered**. You need to be registered as an active parishioner for at least three months.

Registering is easy. Come to the parish office and register! Office hours are Monday - Friday, 9:00am-5:00pm and closed for lunch 1:00pm - 2:00pm.
