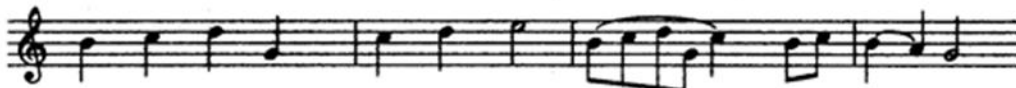

as judge of the living and the dead.

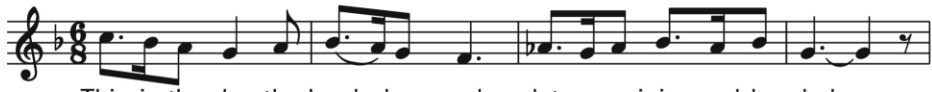

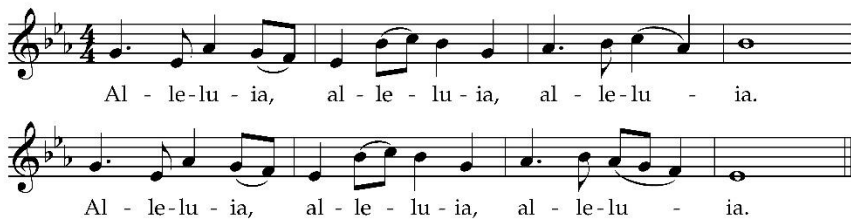

Jn 20:1-9
