I am also appreciative of the efforts of the Social Justice committee through their Fair Trade Sale and other fund raisers to help those in need on a wider scale which has been the Philippines this past year after the typhoon.

# **Request for Papal Blessings**

If you have a special event coming up in your own life or in the life of your family, e.g., wedding, 25th wedding anniversary, special birthday, you may want to request a Papal Blessing to mark the occasion. The blessings can come from either the Vatican itself or the Vatican Embassy in Washington, D.C.

#### Please note the following guidelines:

1.) The individuals named in the blessing must be practicing Catholics;

2.) Only one blessing can be obtained per person;

3.) If requested from the Vatican, the blessing should be requested 4 months in advance of the occasion. The cost is \$45.00.

4.) If requested from the Vatican Embassy in Washington, D.C., the blessing should be requested 2 months in advance. The cost is \$30.00.

These requests have to be made through the St. Mary's office. Please plan ahead if you want to request a Papal Blessing.

## <u>Archbishop's Annual Appeal ----</u> <u>"When I called, you answered"</u>


Thank you to the many families who have already contributed the Archbishop's Annual Appeal! To date, we have received over **<u>\$43,346.00</u>** in pledges.
