Parents should register for the Baptism Preparation Program at the rectory...even before the baby is born!


Catechumenate

Pastor's Corner Dear Friends,

This coming week we begin the holy season of Lent. February 18 is Ash Wednesday. Masses will be at 7:00am, 8:45am, and 7:30pm. There will also be a 3:30pm Prayer Service. Ashes will be distributed at all the services and they will take place in the Upper Church. In last week's bulletin, we published the Lenten Calendar. Please refer to this calendar as it contains all of the spiritual offerings and ideas to help make this a truly holy season for you. I draw your attention specifically to our Parish Mission that will take place here at St. Mary's on Sunday, Feb. 22 (7:00pm), Monday, Feb. 23 (7:15pm), and Tuesday, Feb. 24 (7:15pm); all held in the Upper Church. This mission will be led by Sister Jean McLoughlin, SSND, a school Sister of Notre Dame and her topic throughout the three days will be on "Traveling the Gospel of Mark (with A beautiful way to enrich your sneakers on)". Lenten Season.

Lent is also a penitential time for us as Catholic Christians. There are many opportunities to go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is always offered on Saturday afternoons at 4:00pm. Confessions will be offered on three Mondays of Lent at 7:30pm March 9, 16, and 23. Our Communal Reconciliation Service will be held at St. John's, Bergenfield on Saturday, March 21 at 1:00pm. The beautiful tradition of Stations of the Cross will take place on the Fridays of Lent at 7:30pm in the lower church.

These are just some of the many offerings for us during Lent.

As we begin this season of Lent, Sr. Joan Chittister, OSB, gives us something to think about. She says:

Lent is not a ritual. It is time given to think seriously about who Jesus is for us, to renew our faith from the inside out. It is the moment when, as the baptismal waters flow on every Easter Vigil altar, we return to the baptismal font of the heart to say yes once more to the call of Jesus to the disciples, "Come and see" (John 1:39). It is the act of beginning our spiritual life all over again refreshed and reoriented.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2015 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, <u>February 22, 2015</u> to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, <u>May 31,</u> <u>2015</u>.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
