PD Reflections,

Last week's visit of Pope Francis to our area created quite a buzz and I am wondering how long it might be able to last. Almost everyone I spoke to watched the various activities and some found themselves tubed in most of the day. It was not only what Pope Francis said but how he related to people. His arm must have gotten tired as he kept waving from the Fiat, the Pope-mobile and even from the plane.

I was impressed by all his addresses and sermons but the first one that really struck me was the address to Congress. His English was great and his message was powerful. I was particularly impressed by the choice of people who might serve as examples. The first two are very familiar to us, namely Abraham Lincoln and Martin Luther King, Jr. The others might not be so recognizable, Dorothy Day and Thomas Merton.

During the Bicentennial year of 1976, the American bishops conducted a Call to Action. I recall attending one of the sessions in St. Lucy's Parish in Newark. I was sitting and listening to the presentations when a small woman came in and sat next to me. I recognized Dorothy Day from pictures I had seen and she spoke to the bishops on behalf of the poor. She founded the Catholic Worker Movement which sponsored places of hospitality for the homeless. Although Dorothy died four years later the work continues.

The other person was Thomas Merton who became a Trappist monk at the monastery of Gethsemani in Kentucky. Many people have read his story in the book The Seven Storey Mountain. He has written several other books about prayer and numerous letters to people like Pope John XXIII and even Dorothy Day. In his solitude in the monastery and even the hermitage he lived in, he called people to a deeper life of prayer. I guess a Pope who gets up at 4:00 AM to pray would be able to cite Merton.

A personal connection for me is that I don't often visit graves but I have been to Martin Luther King's grave in Atlanta and Thomas Merton's grave near the monastery chapel in Kentucky.

By now the Pope is back in Rome and life around here goes on. It is my hope that the Francis effect continues in our church, our area and our country. And let us not forget the thing he said over and over. "Pray for me".

On October 9, students will combine fundraising with a focus on physical fitness at the annual Funds for Fitness campaign.


