

#### Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

*Ministry to the Sick and Homebound* The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

*God's Plan for Giving - Tithing* Tithing is God's plan to support His Church. Full tithing means 10% of gross income to God. We ask half of this, or 5%, for your parish Church. The other 5% goes to your favorite charities.

# PD Reflections

This is another in my series of reflections on the visit of Pope Francis to our country and to our area. In two previous bulletins, I have cited his visits to Washington, DC and New York City, so logically I am reflecting on his visit to Philadelphia. Preaching in the Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul, the Pope remarked that he learned the construction of the structure in the 19th century required high walls and windows because of the opposition to the Church in those days. He added, "The story of the church in this country and this city is not about building walls but breaking them down." I was happy to hear this. In recent years I have encountered many instances of walls being built and fewer efforts to welcome people in.

Pope Francis cited the example of St. Katherine Drexel during his time in Philly. The daughter of a rich father, Katherine had a love for the poor especially native Americans and blacks. She had the opportunity to go to Rome and met with Pope Leo XIII and asked him to send missionaries to help her. Pope Leo XIII asked her to do So she became a religious something herself. woman and founded the Sisters of the Blessed Pope Francis suggests that we all Sacrament. respond to that invitation. What are we doing to spread the joy of the Gospel to the people we meet each dav?

Three brief reflections cannot capture all that was said and done in the five days the Pope was here. The recurring image I recall is the waving hand whether from the Fiat back window, the Popemobile or even from the window of the plane. May we not forget what he said and did and let us not forget the request he made over and over again that we should pray for him.


