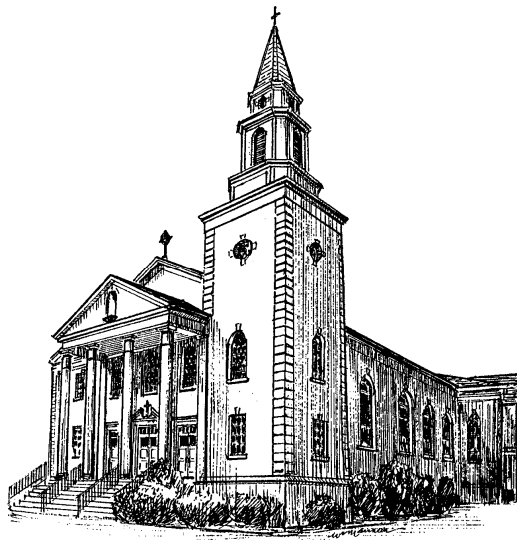

Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

PD Reflections

As Daylight Savings ends early next Sunday morning, we are about to experience the often dramatic change of adjusting the time one hour. As we "fall back" we gain an hour and we will notice the change next Sunday evening when it will get dark an hour earlier. It will also be brighter earlier in the morning. Many people prefer gaining the hour in November to losing it in March and others really find both changes disrupt their sleeping schedule.

What are you going to do with that extra hour? Most people probably stay up a little later. Perhaps they will watch the World Series or stay up to watch a college football game. Those who read before they sleep may enjoy an extra chapter. I am reminded of Jesus words to the disciples in the Garden of Olives, "Can you spend an hour to pray with me?"

The passage of time can be marked with a clock or watch or even a cell phone, but sometime we feel that time flies while other days it seems to drag on. When we are enjoying ourselves the time might seem to pass quickly while if we are waiting for an appointment in the doctor's office it might seem like forever.

Do you find yourself thinking "I have so little time?" Think about that sentence. We all have the same amount of time each day. Each of us will have that extra hour. How will we use it? Many people have a list of things we never seem to find the time to do. Why not chose one of them this week and do it?

And of course, turn your clocks back next weekend or you will arrive an hour early for church and wonder where everyone is.

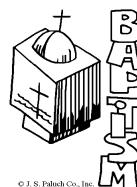

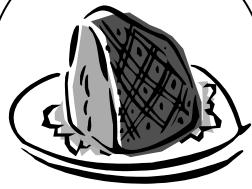
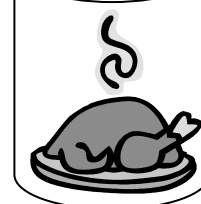
