



PD Reflections

Tuesday of this week is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. It is also the beginning of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. Many times Jubilee years take place every 25 years as 1975 and 2000 were years of Jubilee. However Pope Francis has shown a willingness to do things in a new way. Interestingly such Holy Years begin the First Sunday of Advent but this one begins on the 50th anniversary of the conclusion of the Second Vatican Council.

A few years ago Pope Francis mentioned that he was reading a book that impressed him. The title of the book was Mercy and the author is Cardinal Walter Kasper. The subtitle is The Essence of the Gospel and the Key to Christian Life. Cardinal Kasper investigates the scriptural basis for God's mercy, the ways the ministry of Jesus were signs of mercy and the challenge to the church and to Christians to put mercy into practice.

Pope Francis said that this book has done him a lot of good. When we heard the Pope speak during his trip to our area, we can see how mercy has become such an important concept for him. A Holy Year is a time of grace and a time of prayer. Let us pray that we may experience more profoundly God's mercy toward us. May we work together to fashion a parish community of mercy and welcome to others. May the Church continue to put into practice the renewal begun at the Second Vatican Council and be an instrument of God's mercy and kindness to a world which needs such gifts so much.

"Peace is Born from the Heart"

In a couple of weeks we will remember the shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary school and the 20 children, 6 staff members, the shooter's mother and the shooter. Since then there have been at least 160 shootings at a school.

This past Labor Day weekend 145 people were shot to death and 302 were wounded by gunfire. This is includes a 5-year old boy who was shot and killed by his mother, who had fired at her boyfriend in the heat of i an argument. Also killed that weekend were a New York State government lawyer and a Detroit rapper.

This year has seen 337 mass shootings (4 or more people shot in a single incident). The most violent day was August 2nd, when there were five mass shootings (www.shootingtracker.com).

What should our response be? Below are excerpts from statements issued by various religious leaders:

The tragedy of the past days has called the nation into a period of mourning. We are all deeply affected by the killings in Newtown, Connecticut. Perhaps it was the thought of first graders suffering such brutality, innocent children enduring trauma just before Christmas. Perhaps it was the tragedy of yet another young person losing complete control while suffering from mental illness. Perhaps it is the poignant reminder that every day in urban areas, children are gunned down, often by other children. There is much to mourn, but mourning is not enough. The killing must stop. America is losing its future. Gun regulation is an imperative. Automatic weapons created for the battlefield have no place in the hands of children or adults incapable of taking responsibility for their use. This societal rupture has been going on far too long and demands immediate action by our national leaders. This is not about protecting the second amendment, but rather protecting the most precious resource we have - the gift of life. This is also a time to restore civility to our world and work to change the pervasive culture of violence found throughout this nation, and especially in the entertainment industry.

The Sandy Hook tragedy has caused great anguish for parents and others who attempt to safeguard our children. In addition to the outpouring of prayers and support from around the nation, understandably this tragedy has given rise to discussions about national policies and steps that can be taken to foster a culture that protects the innocent and those most vulnerable among us. It is time for our nation to renew a culture of life in our society.

Sacred Scripture reminds us time and again to "be not afraid." Indeed, we must find within ourselves the faith-filled courage to address the challenges our nation faces, both in our homes and in our national policies. These challenges encompass many areas with various complexities. Here, we offer particular words regarding the issue of the regulation of fire arms, the standards for the entertainment industry, and our service to those with mental health needs. As religious leaders, we are compelled to call on all Americans, especially elected leaders, to address these issues.

With regard to the regulation of firearms, first, the intent to protect one's loved ones is an honorable one, but simply | put, guns are too easily accessible. The Vatican's Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace, in their document, "The | International Arms Trade (2006)," emphasized the importance of enacting concrete controls on handguns, for | example, noting that "limiting the purchase of such arms would certainly not infringe on the rights of anyone."

Gun violence is taking an unacceptable toll on our society, in mass killings and in the constant day-to-day of senseless death. While we continue to pray for the families and friends of those who died, we must also support our prayers with action. We should do everything possible to keep guns out of the hands of people who may harm themselves or others.

Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, Jan. 2013 (includes leaders from Protestant, Muslim, Jewish, Hindu and Catholic faiths)

It is estimated that Americans today possess about 300 million firearms. No one can be under the illusion that limiting their number and use would be enough to impede horrendous massacres in the future, such as the one in Newtown, which shook the conscience of Americans and of the world, of children and adults alike. But it would be much worse if we were to satisfy ourselves with only words. And if the massacres are carried out by people with mental illness or distorted by hate, there is no doubt that they are carried out with arms. Forty-seven religious leaders of various confessions and religions have issued a call to American politicians to limit firearms, which "are making society pay an unacceptable price in terms of massacres and senseless deaths." I'm with them.

Peace is born from the heart, but it will be easier to achieve if we have fewer weapons in hand.
