

Capital Campaign

I am pleased to report that parish pledges to the Capital Campaign now exceed \$220,000. I am truly grateful to all those who have chosen to participate in this vital fund raising effort. While several parishioners have expressed doubt that we will ever reach our parish goal of \$677,293, I am hopefully optimistic.

At the request of a few of those with some doubt, I'd like to run through the numbers given that would enable us to meet our goal. St. Mary's parish has 2,200 registered families. If just 500 of those registered families made a pledge of \$339 per year for the 4 years of the campaign, we would exceed goal. A pledge of \$339 a year is less than \$29 a month; less than a dollar a day. Pledges can be paid on a monthly basis and can even be charged to a credit card for convenience.

I understand that not everyone is in a position to make such a pledge. We appreciate any participation you are able to give. No gift is too small. Members of the Campaign Committee will soon be reaching out to those registered families that have yet to participate. We thank everyone for their prayers and support.
