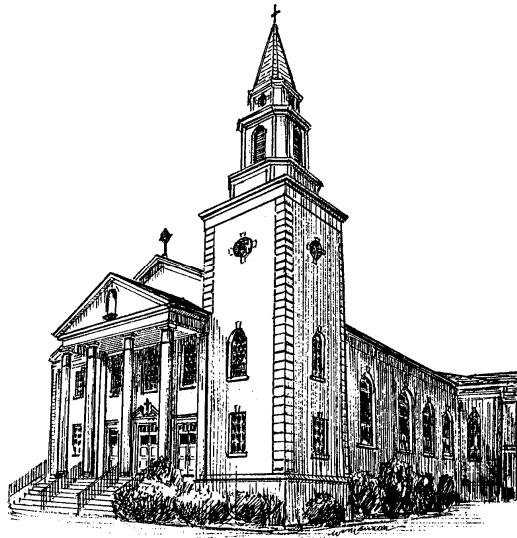

Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Pastor**



Last Sunday, members of the Knights of Columbus and the Columbiettes hosted a Communion Breakfast following the 10 O'clock mass. The guest speaker at this breakfast was Kathy DiFiore, the founder of Several Sources; a foundation committed to helping unwed mothers and other women facing a crisis pregnancy. By hosting women in shelters, Several Sources Foundation provides an alternative for those women who are considering an abortion.

Ms. DiFiore brought with her a young woman who is currently living in a Several Sources Shelter and her infant daughter who was saved from an abortion through the efforts of her foundation. This young woman shared her story; a profound story of hope. She also introduced us to her beautiful daughter; a child that very easily could have been lost to the crime of abortion. This child was living proof that every child conceived has the right to be born.

As Catholic Christians, we have a duty to proclaim our Lord's Gospel of Life and we need to support those who put their faith into action as they work to protect the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death. Most importantly, we need to pray for those who are considering abortion as a solution to a crisis pregnancy. We need to pray that they will realize that there are alternatives, that there is always hope and, that no matter what, God still loves them. We also need to pray that law makers will experience a change of heart and realize that all human life is a precious gift from God.

Capital Campaign Status Report

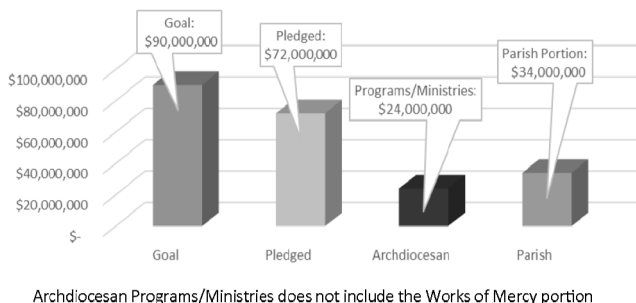
